



Health & Safety Policy Statement

CBH provides its products and services to the Power and Process Industries in Australia, Oceania and South East Asia.

To this effect, all managers, supervisors and employees have a shared responsibility to follow defined Health and Safety requirements, to observe agreed procedures and to initiate actions to prevent incidents through the rectification of identified or suspected hazards or risks.

These objectives are seen as being central to the suitability, effectiveness and ongoing improvement of our Occupational Health and Safety Management Programs.

Without excluding any statutory or regulatory standards and requirements, where there is a variation between a customer's Health & Safety standards and/or requirements and those of the Company, the standard or requirement which provides the highest level of Risk Minimisation for the Health & Safety of all persons on site shall be adopted as the minimum standard or requirement. It is the customer's responsibility to provide any relevant customer standards or requirements to Clyde Babcock-Hitachi prior to the commencement of work on site.
